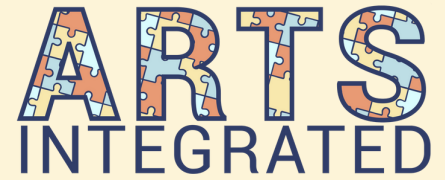


# Filming



## OVERVIEW

Filming is the process of being able to capture a series of planned shots or recording an event using a camera. There are many applications for filming in the classroom, including activities like: Document, Recreate a Scene, Trailer Project, Interview Project, and Tell a Story.

## DIRECTONS

- ▶ Students create a list of shots or storyboards to plan out what they are going to film
- ▶ Students adjust their camera settings using the [iPhone](#) or [Android](#) filming guides
- ▶ Show the different types of shots and filming tips on [artsintegrated.org/filming](https://artsintegrated.org/filming)
- ▶ Give students plenty of time to complete the filming for their projects

## POSSIBLE ACTIVITIES

### DOCUMENT

Students can capture a scientific experiment, field trip, math problem, or activity.

### TELL A STORY

Develop and create an original film.

### RECREATE A SCENE

Students can make a short film inspired by a book, chapter, historical event, or lesson.

### TRAILER PROJECT

Students can develop a short trailer using filmed and/or existing footage.

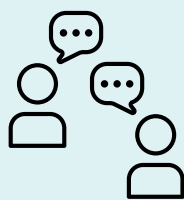
### INTERVIEW PROJECT

Interview someone who is an expert on a given topic or someone impacted by a specific event.

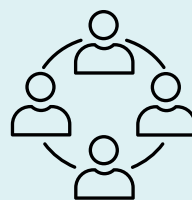
